What does the Fund invest in?

The Fund primarily invests in a mix of global equity securities emphasizing global economic regions and industrial sectors identified as having the greatest performance potential. Approximately 0% to 10% of the Fund’s portfolio is actively managed by Return On Innovation Advisors Ltd. and approximately 90% to 100% of the Fund’s portfolio is actively advised by WHV Investment Management, Inc. and Hirayama Investments, LLC. The charts below provide you with a snapshot of the Fund’s investments on March 31, 2015. The Fund’s investments will change.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund’s returns change over time. This is called “volatility”.

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

ROI Capital has rated the volatility of this Fund as **medium to high**. This rating is based on how much the Fund’s returns have changed from year to year. It doesn’t tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

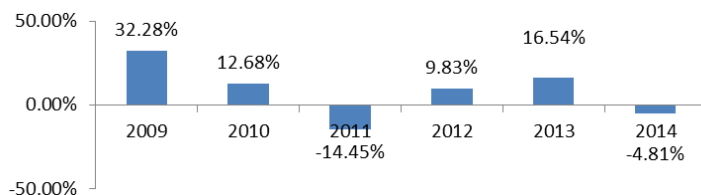
Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn’t have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how Series A units of the Fund have performed over the past 6 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A units of the Fund performed in each of the past 6 years. The Fund dropped in value in 2 of the 6 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.


Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A units of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 6 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

The annual compounded return of Series A units of the Fund was 7.68% since inception. If you had invested \$1,000 in the Fund 6 years ago, your investment would now be worth \$1,558.87.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account. Keep in mind that if you hold your Fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A units of the Fund. The fees and expenses — including any commissions — can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

You have to choose a sales charge option when you buy the Fund. Ask about the pros and cons of each option.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the series' returns. As of December 31, 2014, the fund's expenses were 3.57% of its value. This equals \$35.70 for every \$1,000 invested.

Annual Rate (as a % of the Fund's assets)

Management expense ratio (MER)

This is the total of the Fund's management fee (which includes the trailing commission) and operating expenses. 3.54%

Trading expense ratio (TER)

These are the Fund's trading costs. 0.03%

Fund expenses

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

ROI Capital pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2% of value of units redeemed or switched within 30 days of purchase/switch • 1% of value of units redeemed or switched within 31 days to 90 days of purchase/switch
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the value of units you switch to another series of the Fund or another ROI Mutual Fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
